Making better places

Placemaking is at the centre of Council's *Draft Public Spaces and Recreation Strategy* as the city welcomes another 13,000 residents over the coming years.



Willoughby City has 455 hectares of public spaces including parks, playgrounds, waterfronts, and sports grounds, and they're becoming increasingly important to the community. The *Draft Public Spaces and Recreation* *Strategy* guides the planning and management of these spaces.

The Draft Strategy outlines a new approach of placemaking which helps identify opportunities to reimagine public spaces in partnership with the community, with the aim to increase recreational opportunities, and deliver spaces that respond to community needs.

A recent *Paint the Playground* activation at Bales Park playground, offered children (pictured left) the opportunity to paint a newly installed tunnel. The activation was conceived as part of

Artarmon Streetscape Upgrade

Works resumed on 8 January this year and include the continuation of footpath widening, paving, drainage and roadworks, construction of the retaining wall and terrace seating area. Broughton Street has been closed to traffic and variable message signs are in place directing traffic south one way through Hampden Lane. Work has also commenced on the amenities block, station side of Hampden Road.

Once the current stage is complete, the next stages will include installation of traffic signals at the corner of Hampden and Broughton Road, construction of terrace

seating and footpath curb extensions and blisters at the Village Green. The project is on schedule and is proposed to be completed by mid-2024. To receive updates on this project scan the QR code.



Edward Street and Penshurst Street South Streetscape Improvement Project

This street corridor improvement project will encompass street greening, traffic calming improvements to make the corridor safer, cooler, and more inviting for the community. After conducting two community workshops last year, more than two thirds of respondents supported this project.

In January this year, Council commenced working with external consultants on the design process. The process is expected to run for the next four

months before planned community workshops expected around mid 2024. Council will be promoting the workshops in advance to allow the community to participate. Scan the QR code register.





Naremburn Streetscape Upgrade

An exciting new public space is being created for the Naremburn community to enjoy! The Naremburn local centre streetscape upgrade will be commencing construction within the next few months. This streetscape upgrade to Naremburn's local business centre is jointly funded by Council and the Department of Infrastructure, Transport, Regional Development and Communications through its Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program (LRCI). This upgrade will provide easier access for pedestrians, cyclists, and bus passengers, enhance facilities for the public to improve and extend visitation time and create higher economic activity to support our local businesses.

EMBRACE CLEAN ENERGY

Residents and business owners can begin their journey to a cleaner and healthier future through electrification and solar initiatives offered by Council.

Chatswood resident Brian Peck (pictured right) was motivated to electrify his 48-unit apartment building as part of his commitment to living a greener lifestyle. His electrification journey has seen him install an induction cooktop (pictured right) for his apartment, but it's his collaborative efforts with his building's Owners Corporation that is the most impressive. He spearheaded two major capital works: a 30kW rooftop solar PV system to supply much of the electricity required for the common areas, and an industrial electric heat pump for all residents' hot water (pictured right).
